

OHIO EGG FACTS

Ohio is one of the **LARGEST EGG FARMING STATES IN THE NATION.**

Ohio has **MORE THAN 42 MILLION** laying hens.¹

Ohio produces more than **11 BILLION EGGS**¹ per year and provides as much as **\$5.52 BILLION**² in support to the state's economy.

Ohio egg production is responsible for the creation of **19,015 JOBS** annually and **\$1 BILLION** in earnings.²



- The Ohio Egg Quality Assurance Program (OEQAP) is a voluntary program that was created to minimize the risk of Salmonella Enteritidis (SE) in eggs, and is a cooperative effort between egg producers and farmers, the Ohio Poultry Association and the Ohio Department of Agriculture.
- Ohio's egg farms follow FDA's Federal Egg Safety Rule, which ensures eggs are safe and free from Salmonella and other foodborne bacteria.
- Ohio egg farmers participate in the **United Egg Producers Certified animal care program**. The guidelines place top priority on the comfort, health and safety of the chickens and include increased space per hen.
